

## RNCSF Anti-Racism Ambassadors Brief description and registration of interest

Since November 2020, our Alumni Leadership Council has been advising the Royal National Children's SpringBoard Foundation (RNCSF) about how we, our schools, and our partner organisations can best protect and support pupils from black and minority ethnic backgrounds. The Council's recently published <a href="Anti-Racism Charter for RNCSF schools">Anti-Racism Charter for RNCSF schools</a> provides clear recommendations for actions which the Council believes will make a tangible difference to SpringBoarders' experiences of racism. The Charter provide a framework for high standards and collective progress across the RNCSF network of schools.

We are committed to supporting RNCSF accredited schools to make progress towards the recommendations in this Charter and believe that alumni have an important role to play as part of this. We are seeking a number of alumni to champion the Charter within schools, and facilitate discussions about the issues it raises. This is an opportunity for alumni to play an active role to influence change across the UK's boarding sector. We will support you with the training you will need to become effective campaigners for change.

## Role overview

As a volunteer RNCSF Anti-Racism Ambassador, you will help schools to understand, consider and apply the recommendations from the Anti-Racism Charter. You will need to be comfortable participating in conversations with a range of senior stakeholders; show a commitment to the importance of building anti-racist school environments, and you be able to inspire, challenge and guide those you speak to, enabling them to feel more confident in fighting racism — in all its forms — within their school.

You will do so through:

- Participating in Teacher Training Day sessions;
- Preparing and delivering presentations that help to raise awareness of racism and other equality issues, and promote tangible recommendations for changes that would make a difference;
- Building an understanding and demonstrate awareness of other schools-based initiatives and relevant groups, such as school Equality, Diversity and Inclusion groups.
